Grant says his ideas are fluid and he draws inspiration from everyday life and current headlines, but never repeats a look from year to year. David comes to the table with a host of creative ideas, fine-tuned throughout the year to incorporate the chosen theme. Carving will take place on October 29 from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. at The Settlers Inn. The New York Times writer and former film and theater critic is known for his offbeat and outrageous humor. He has performed at well-known storytelling venues such as The Moth and his plays have been performed at the New York International Fringe Festival.
